February Health Focus



Happy New Year!!!!

As we start a new year, it is important to take a little time to review some points to help give you a better peace of mind for a safe household and the ability to handle any emergencies!

- **First Aid Kit**

Do you have a first aid kit? If so, when was the last time you checked it?

- Pull out all your medications and look at the expiration dates. Throw away anything that's expired. This includes:
 - Pain relievers like ibuprofen and acetaminophen
 - Antibiotic ointments
 - Anti-itch creams
 - Allergy medicines
 - Any prescription medications you keep for emergencies

- Check supplies and restock as needed

- Adhesive bandages in different sizes
- Gauze pads and rolls
- Medical tape
- Antiseptic wipes
- Disposable gloves
- Tweezers
- Scissors (blunt edge)
- Safety pins
- Instant cold pack
- Digital thermometer

- Customize the kit to your specific needs

- **Test Your Batteries** Grab your flashlight, battery-powered radio and any other emergency equipment. Make sure they still work. Pop in fresh batteries or make sure your rechargeable ones still hold a charge.

- **Review your contact list** Check your emergency contact list to ensure phone numbers are still current and print out a copy. Consider including:

- Family members and their current cell numbers
- Out-of-state contact person (for when local lines are jammed)
- Your kids' schools and daycare centers
- Your workplace numbers
- Doctors and veterinarian
- Insurance company
- Utility companies

- **Have an Emergency plan** Determine what to do in case of need to leave your home and review with your family.

Consider including:


- Where do we meet if we can't get back home?
- Who do we call if we get separated?
- What do we grab if we need to leave fast?
- Where are the fire extinguishers?
- How do we shut off the water and gas?

- **Know what to do in case of fire**

- Check fire extinguishers if you have one
- Ensure doors are not blocked
- Check smoke alarms
- Establish outside place to go in case of fire

Reviewing the above practices will help to ensure you are ready for whatever 2026 brings!!!
