Kairos Moments ...

(05/07/24) Reflections of Reverend Pamela Moyer

Happy Church Anniversary! Happy Mother's Day! And Memorial Day! Happy Nurses Week, and Teachers' Appreciation Day! Wow, April and May have a lot of holidays to recognize. First I want to publicly thank Chaplain Anne Smith again for preaching for me on Sunday, April 14th about Zaccheus. Since I had been at a wedding out of town on Saturday, it allowed me to just lead the service, and be ministered to by her message. We learned of Christ's humanity to enjoy Zaccheus' hospitality and Christ's acceptance of him, even though tax collectors were considered greedy, dishonest, and shunned by most.

The next Sunday, we spent some time finding beauty in music and the arts, with 2 Samuel 6:1-5, Colossians 3:12-17, Exodus 35:31-33, and 2 Chronicles 2:13-14, asking ourselves why do we come to worship each week? Let me also ask why don't some of us come to worship anymore, since the pandemic or long before? For some, it becomes a habit, a social club, or entertainment. However, most of us attend from a desire for God's presence in a "sacred" space with like-minded people. We also seek beauty, fulfillment, awe, and inspiration as we participate in the worship experience. We were formed in the image of God (Imago Dei) and therefore have a creative need to express our love and faith through hymns, anthems, instrumental music, drama, poetry, liturgical dance, craft, art, flowers, beauty, and more. When I was in Israel, making several museum and archaeoligical stops along the way, it was truly a joy to see and photograph the historic creative arts (tiles, mosaics, architecture, cathedrals, sculpture, textiles, jewelry, icons, and to hear different music).

That next Sunday was our 21st Anniversary! You blended two sacred dwellings and a third congregation into a brand-new Body of Christ. In the months leading up to the first official worship of The United Baptist Church on April 27, 2003, you and many others prayed and pondered a consolidation. You were pilgrims and pioneers when you joined your resources, missions, ministries, and people. Last year was our milestone, but this year, we glanced back briefly and gazed forward to all that God has in store for us. We recalled why and how we are church in Acts 2:42-47, and pondered how we can make our light shine more in the world (Luke 8:16-17) so we do not hide what God is doing here. Parish Nurse's Touch Debbie Caffrey May Health Focus



The warm weather is back, and we are all anxious to get back outside!!! Here are some tips for a fun, safe summer:

- The cicadas return to Fairfax county late April and will be with us through June
- Stay out of the direct sun. Seek shaded or air-conditioned areas such as libraries or malls.
- Drink plenty of fluids. (Avoid alcohol and caffeine.)
- Wear light-colored, light-weight clothing. Use hats with brims and sunscreen for more protection.
- Anyone showing signs of heat stroke (altered mental state, not sweating, nausea) should seek medical attention immediately.
- Apply sunscreen with SPF 30 or higher and both UVA and UVB protection before you go outside, even on cloudy days.
- Ticks are most active in late June and early July. Prevent Lyme Disease and other tick-borne illnesses by avoiding ticks and tick bites.
- Mosquitoes are most active in the summer months.
 Protect yourself against West Nile Virus and other
 mosquito-borne illnesses by using bug spray with DEET,
 avoiding mosquito breeding grounds, and taking other
 preventive measures.

Nearly 1 in 5 people experience a mental health concern each year, according to the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI). More than 1 in 20 adults experience serious mental illness that interferes with or limits major life activities. Mental illness, including depression, substance use disorders, anxiety, or psychosis can happen to anyone. By talking about mental health this May, you can help shine a light on the presence of mental health issues and eliminate stigma surrounding mental illness.

Practice healthy self-care strategies to improve your mental health:

- o Exercise. Even a small amount can make a big difference in your day.
- o Connect with someone. Make a phone call or visit with a friend or family member.
- o Start a cycle of encouragement; tell others what you appreciate about them.
- o Listen to music that inspires and motivates you.
- o Write a poem on something you care about, or an article on something you feel is interesting.
